POTTER COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING

April 17, 2025

CALL TO ORDER Commissioner Nancy Grupp called the meeting to order at 11:19 a.m.

MOMENT OF SILENCE/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

<u>ROLL CALL</u> Commissioner Nancy Grupp, Commissioner Paul Heimel, Commissioner Robert Rossman, Chief Clerk Jessica Giebel and Executive Administrative Assistant Paige Barroqueiro; all present.

PUBLIC COMMENT

<u>MINUTES</u> – April 3, 2025 ~ Action ~ Comm. Heimel moved to approve. Comm. Rossman seconded. Heimel yes; Rossman yes. Grupp abstain.

GUESTS

Kal Logue, Community Development Coordinator, and Jamie Shrawder, Program Manager at SEDA-COG, discussed details of the Community Development Block Grant Subrecipient Agreement for FFY 2023/Austin Borough Water Improvement Project. Jamie Shrawder noted that the allocated funding for Fiscal Year 2023 is \$149,786.

Jason Childs and Katie Sasala from the Potter County Conservation District attended the meeting to provide background for the Conservation District Week proclamation. Jason reported that PCCD staff has been busy with approximately \$2,500 in tree sales, preparing for the annual Envirothon for high school students, and conducing educational programs for first graders. He also shared that upcoming work includes five stream improvement projects, 34 construction projects resulting from damage caused by Tropical Storm Debbie, and maintenance work on 26 dirt and gravel roads.

Mike Hager of Tri-Town Fire Company, along with Bill Goltz, Todd Streeter, and Martin Heyler of Crary Hose Fire Company, requested financial support for a live burn training center that is being established to serve all local fire departments. Following the receipt of an OSFC grant, Crary Hose contracted with Forge Fire and Company to construct the facility using Conex boxes, allowing for expansion. Delivery is expected by September. Cost is estimated at \$288,000, of which \$196,883 has already been secured through the support of local fire companies, community organizations, county partners, and grants. Commissioner Grupp expressed the board's interest in supporting the initiative and confirmed that discussions would take place regarding potential contribution. Former Commissioner Ken Wingo also spoke in support, emphasizing that both Goodyear Fire Company and Gale Hose Fire Company are in full support of the project.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

Commissioner Rossman reiterated that the Commissioners are continuing to work on resolving the ongoing issue with Visit Potter Tioga. He noted that a meeting is scheduled for next week with the Tioga County Commissioners, with the goal of reaching a mutual agreement.

Commissioner Heimel reported that, as part of the Revitalize Potter County mission, the commissioners met Dr. Daniel Glunk, president of UPMC Cole and UPMC Wellsboro, to receive feedback on factors about Potter County that have been obstacles in the recruitment of professionals. The input will help guide the Revitalize Potter County team to identify factors that make the area less attractive to potential new residents and exploring actionable solutions to address those challenges.

Commissioner Grupp detailed the Floodplain Management held in Wellsboro with Pa. Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) representatives. She reported that Erb Inspections, which serves as floodplain inspector for most Potter County municipalities, will discontinue services after January 2026. Township and borough officials will be required to complete a four-day training course to become certified in floodplain management. While the nearest training is currently offered in Lewisburg, Commissioner Grupp is working to bring a session to the Gunzburger Building Auditorium. PEMA also announced that each municipality will be audited, and those that do not pass will jeopardize their residents' ability to obtain flood insurance. She emphasized the importance of completing the training to ensure municipalities are prepared and able to meet audit requirements.

Whereas, districts work in partnership with government agencies, private organizations, businesses, and others on the local, state, and federal level to accomplish their mission of helping landowners conserve natural resources; and

Whereas, each district is led by a volunteer board of directors made up of farmers, public members, and a member of county government, which identifies local conservation needs, decides which programs and services to offer, and develops a strategic plan; therefore be it

Resolved, that we, the Potter County Commissioners, do hereby proclaim April 20-26, 2025, as Conservation District Week to commemorate the valuable work accomplished by Pennsylvania's 66 Conservation Districts.
