COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

Commissioner Hayman announced that with elections next Tuesday, November 7, 2023, there was an error of omission with the ballot on the voting machines in Portage, Warton, and Homer Township regarding write-in options. Therefore, there will be paper ballots with privacy envelopes and ballot boxes. As soon as this matter was recognized it was addressed promptly and professionally.

A written summary from Commissioner Heimel was presented, updating the board on the progress in contacting members of the state legislature urging support of higher payments-in-lieu of taxes (PILT) on state forest, park, and game lands. If the measure is passed, it would increase the PILT from \$2.00 to \$2.40 per acre for countries, school districts and municipalities for state park and forest lands; and double it from \$1.20 to \$2.40 per acre. The bottom line for Potter County is about \$250,000 more per year coming from the state, providing real estate tax relief for county residents.



Dear Commissioner Grupp,

In 2007, Act 44 was enacted to provide funds for Pennsylvania's transportation infrastructure which includes public transportation. While Act 44 requires 15% match, it permits transit systems to waive the 15% local match in favor of a 5% incremental increase annually. ATA was successful in obtaining this waiver for our counites.

The local match requirement for the ATA Fiscal Year July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025, is calculated as follows:

FY 07/01/23 – 06/30/24 Local Match Assessment	\$40,236.00
5% increase for FY 07/01/24 - 06/30/25	\$2,012.00
Total FY 07/01/24 - 06/30/25 Local Match Assessment	\$42,248.00
